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Public Outreach

What is Public Outreach?

"When anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, let the hand of Al-Anon and Alateen always be there, and Let It Begin With Me."

"Carrying the message, as suggested in the Twelfth Step, is Service, Al-Anon's third legacy. Service, a vital purpose of Al-Anon, is Action. Members strive to do as well as to be. Anything done to help a relative or friend of an alcoholic is service: a telephone call to a despairing member or sponsoring a newcomer, telling one's story at meetings, forming groups, arranging for public outreach, distributing literature, and financially supporting groups, local services, and the World Service Office."

"Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these steps, we tried to carry this message to others and to practice these principles in all our affairs."

Sound familiar? We read or recite these very words at every meeting. Public Outreach is all these things. In essence, it is getting the word out about Al-Anon and Alateen. Unlike other service positions, Public Outreach is really part of our every day lives as we work the program. So, becoming Public Outreach Coordinator is nothing more that helping to coordinate activities that we, as a fellowship, do all the time.

"I believe the main reason for my growth in Al-Anon has resulted from getting involved in service. There is nothing more rewarding than to see someone who first came to Al-Anon or Alateen, who is in despair and without any hope, that begins to see that there is hope and serenity,

Ask It Basket July 26, 2014 District Meeting

- 1. What are the criteria for an AA holding an office in an Al-Anon meeting? Which offices can they hold / not hold? Answer: AAs cannot hold any office that lead to policy further information making. For see: anon.org/members. Click Al-Anon/Alateen 2014-2017 Service Manual icon. There is a link that says, "April, 2014 updates pages 82, 83, 126. The section titled "Service Participation By Members of Al-Anon Family Groups Who Are Also Members of Alcoholics Anonymous" begins on page 82 and continues of page 126. AAs cannot be a GR, Alternate GR, DR, Alternate DR, Delegate or Alternate Delegate. Our District and Area do not have AAs in any service position at district or area level. Also see Many Voices, One Journey, page 184. I have a chart on dual members' criteria for service (Paula).
- 2. My group has had a question about whether or not it is OK to refer to AA's Big Book in a personal share. For example-using the AA Step 4 inventory process. What is the best course of action?

Answer: It is okay to make reference to the Big Book in a personal share, but individuals shouldn't bring the book to the meeting. If the person is a newcomer, he/she can be approached after the meeting. If it becomes a chronic

- problem, the meeting chair can address during meeting. See page 104 of Service Manual.
- 3. Why are we not adhering to ADA standards by not providing large print texts for all literature, and why are we not bringing the ones we have to all district meetings? *Answer:* We have vision impaired members as well as those with problems with small print. WSO must approve all new literature printing. Make your need known to Area Delegate and Literature Coordinator. We will bring large print daily readers to district meetings from now on. [Other comments were: WSO does not have the money for this now; Look at the AudioBooks; WSO operates on requests from the fellowship, email Nancy M., our Delegate; Our current daily readers are all in large print.]
- 4. I subscribed to the newsletter, Forum, and Beacon in January 2014. I did not receive my first issue of The Beacon until July 2014. Is there some problem? Are the problems worked out? I would like to encourage group members to get personal subscriptions. I recently saw a donation form in the Beacon. My question is: What is the correct form/procedure for groups to use when making donations to district and area?

Answer: The answer to this question could not be found.

INFORMATION SERVICE CENTERS

Austin Al-Anon Information Service

The Austin Area Information Service/Literature Distribution Center (AIS/LDC) office is located at 6301 Manchacha Road (Suite F), Austin, TX, 78745. Hours of operation are 10 am to 2 pm, Monday through Friday. We have a website - www.austinalanon.org. When we are not in the office, we have a message that directs callers to our website or to one or two Al-Anon members to get additional information on meetings in the Austin and surrounding areas. Our Information Center (IC) Board meets every other month in the 3rd week.

Our last Board Meeting was July 21. Our chair gave an update that the embezzlement has been settled. A payment of \$10,000 was made to the IC and approximately \$31,000 will continue to be made in incremental payments going forward. Additional updates may be shared at the IC Board meetings.

Our incoming IC call volumes were June (60) and July (55, through mid-month). Our walk-ins at the IC were June (36) and July (22, through mid-month). These call volumes will continue to be tracked and updated monthly and feedback given to the District Financial Task Force that is working hard to increase awareness of Ala-Anon/Alateen in and around the Austin areas. The 800 number calls into

the IC will also be tracked so that the IC Board may determine if this budgeted item is a good use of funds. Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 16, 6:30 pm to 8 pm, at the Northland facility.

Waco Al-Anon Information Service

Our Information Service has many functions. It cooperates with the Public Outreach – North in doing health fairs, open houses, and meetings with parents and grandparents at juvenile detention centers and rehabilitation centers. It also pays the bill for the Yellow Pages ad, both paper and online. Last year we paid \$528 for just the paper Yellow Pages ad, but this year we bundled the two and the total actual cost was \$331.04 for a savings of \$196.96. It also pays for the Post Office box and the pager. We are getting about 5-12 calls per week on the pager. Occasionally we get a Spanish only call and we refer these to a GR of one of the other groups in Waco, who, in turn, calls them back and answers their questions.

District Alateen Coordinator

July 2014

This past May we had an Alateen Group Sponsor Workshop in Austin at the Austin Al-Anon Information Center. It was attended by six folks from District 6, two recertifying, two newly certifying, one currently certified group sponsor attending to share her experience, strength and hope with all, and one newly certifying group sponsor from District 12.

This last quarter was also time for all certified AMIAS to recertify for the 2014-2015 cycle. We lost two group sponsors but added three new group sponsors. Thank you for all who recertified for another year of service for Alateen.

This past May, at the Spring Assembly, we had a presentation to bring a motion to the Area to simplify the certification process for people who are interested in serving Alateen. The motion passed and includes the removal of the two different levels of AMIAS so there is only one level, that of Group Sponsor. The training requirement now requires that anyone interested in serving as an AMIAS attend a workshop facilitated by an Area Trainer and approved by the Area Alateen Coordinator, or to complete a self-guided manual that will be available on the Texas Al-Anon website. This training will be required annually for all AMIAS for the first two years and then every three years for recertification after the first two years.

Also, the requirements for attending a district meeting, a district group sponsor meeting, and attending Alateen meetings prior to certification and recertification have been removed.

Some people have spoken to me that they are not interested in being a group sponsor but wish to be available as a helper only. The new requirements are that, even as just a helper, you will be required to attend a workshop or do the selfguided workshop.

All of this will be on a trial basis for

this coming certification cycle. At this time, the self-guided workshop is still unavailable, but if you are interested in getting certified, even only as a helper, I will be available to do a workshop. I also hope to train someone to do the training so our district will have another Trainer available.

When the new self-guided workshop becomes available, the thought is that the potential AMIAS will contact an Area Approved Trainer for a Q and A session after completing the workshop. This part has not been clarified at this time.

The new certification process has been reviewed by a legal counsel, and we are waiting to hear from World Service Office. Our current Process Person or Area Alateen Coordinator will contact all current AMIAS as to what their requirements will be to recertify at the next cycle.

If you have any question regarding these changes, please feel free to contact me or the Area Alateen Coordinator, Melissa H. Her contact information is available on the hard copy Beacon that your home group's mailing contact should have.

As the current DAC, I am willing to continue offering group sponsor meetings at the district meeting until my term is over. Our gatherings these past three years have been uplifting and informative as we all shared our experiences. I hope to provide this as long as I am DAC.

These changes have been put in place in hopes that we will have more AMIAS and make it easier to start an Alateen group.

A new tool that the World Service is now offering is an E-service manual for AMIAS. It is available on the Al-Anon web site in the members only









section. This is a way for those who may be interested to get a peek at what is involved in becoming an AMIAS.

In our district, we now have twenty certified Group Sponsors and one Helper AMIAS. These people cover seven Alateen meetings from Waco to Wimberley. And for their dedication I am grateful.

I am hoping that the new certification will encourage the two groups who have made inquiries to be inspired to start Alateen meetings at their locations.

And a reminder that this coming October is election time. I have had one person inquire as to their qualifications to be our new District Alateen Coordinator, but I am willing to answer any questions from anyone else who may be interested in standing for this position. I want to thank all who have been here for me and have helped me be what I hope was a good District Alateen Coordinator, I learned a lot about myself and about all our concerns and hopes as Group Sponsors and people who are interested in offering the hand of Alateen for our young people.

New Daily Reader: The 2014 World Service Conference gave conceptual approval for the development of a new daily reader. While the motion calls for a reader "that reflects the diversity of the Al-Anon fellowship," the intent is not to create a reader about diversity, only that the book reflects the Al-Anon program and its members as they are today. More details will be coming soon on how to share in creating this publication.

The Forum

Happy 60th Birthday to *The Forum*. There is good news and bad news about *The Forum*. The good news:

- The magazine delivers information valued by members. Readers say it provides stories that they can relate to, 54% say they read entire magazine the day it comes.
- The magazine appears to reach more deeply into the fellowship than any other publication -33,000 copies distributed monthly to individuals and groups.
- Based on recent surveys, it appears that Forum readers participate in service more strongly than the Al-Anon fellowship as a whole. Based on responders. higher proportion of Forum readers participate in Al-Anon service and at a high level than members of the Al-Anon fellowship as a whole.
- The survey also suggests that Forum readers who are more active in service are more likely to respond to a survey.

The bad news includes:

 Number of personal subscriptions is shrinking at rate of about 100 subscriptions per month, every month, since July, 2010.

Which comes first: Chicken or the Egg? Are Forum readers active in Service because they read The Forum? Or do they read The Forum because they are active in service? Not sure. But more important point is that the two are linked together. Reading The Forum goes hand-in-hand with a strong Al-Anon program that includes participation in service. Two reasons why The Forum plays an essential role in Al-Anon:

1. It gives voice to current and contemporary shared recovery across the worldwide fellowship of Al-Anon.

2. It is the World Service Office's primary pipeline to Al-Anon members who are highly engaged in all aspects of the program, including service.

Because the subscription cost covers printing and mailing, *The Forum* sales do not generate funds that support the WSO's general fund. *Forum* readership can strengthen personal recovery program of every member because of the part it plays in supporting Al-Anon service and Twelfth Step work. Increased readership is a path that supports increased participation in Al-Anon service.

It is important for us to take *The Forum* out of our pockets, and make it part of our Al-Anon meetings, at least once every month. This approach is based on Tradition Eleven: attraction, not promotion. The magazine won't attract increased participation without greater visibility across Al-Anon.

The Forum and Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism serve two very different purposes!

- Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism is designed to address challenges before we were ready to give AFG a try — overcome denial, too embarrassed to ask for help, did not want anyone to know what was going on at home, some think it is a religious group, some believe no one could possibly understand what they were going through.
- In The Forum, members share how the Twelve Steps, Traditions and Concepts of Service have helped them find and keep recovery.

With that in mind, please encourage members and groups to share *The Forum* with one another and share *Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism* with their community.


